The standard protocol for dental treatment of a pregnant patient includes:	
<ul> <li>Necessary radiographs using a double lead shield over the abdomen and thyroid.</li> <li>Restorative and prophylaxis care (including scaling and root planing if necessary), and/or extractions.</li> <li>Local anesthetic, 2% lidocaine.</li> <li>If antibiotic is needed, Category B drugs such as amoxicillin, erythromycin, cephalosporins.</li> <li>If non-narcotic pain management is needed, Category B drugs such as over-the-counter acetaminophen may be used.</li> <li>If narcotic pain management is needed, acetaminophen with codeine #3 during first and second trimesters.</li> <li>Oral rinse chlorhexidine gluconate 0.12%.</li> <li>Prescribed preventive agents such as PreviDent, Fluoridex, and Clinpro dentifrices.</li> </ul>
